

Winnetonka Class Award 2023 Sophomore Application

NOTE: Applicants for this scholarship do NOT need to complete the All-N-One Scholarship Application

Purpose: This scholarship was generously established by Ed Moore through the North Kansas City Schools Education Foundation. It is intended to inspire Winnetonka underclassmen to think about the future and what they plan to do following high school. In addition, it will give them an opportunity to experience and practice the process of applying for college scholarships. Students are eligible to reapply for this scholarship during their junior year at Winnetonka.

Eligibility Criteria:

- Be a current sophomore at Winnetonka High School.
- Be involved in at least one community service activity.
- Have a current GPA of 2.8 or above.
- Plan to pursue a two or four-year degree or enroll in a technical school following graduation.

Application Requirements:

- Complete the **2023 Winnetonka Class Award Sophomore Application** via Microsoft Forms: <u>https://forms.office.com/r/NnwDDzAtDi</u>
- Include a copy of your high school transcript
- **One letter of reference** from a teacher or outside source, such as a minister or service group leader.
- Volunteer activities: On a separate page, explain what kind of community service activity or activities you do and why you volunteer.
- Short Essay: Also attach a separate page that describes what TONKA T.R.U.E. (Tradition, Respect, Unity, Excellence) means to you.

Amount: One scholarship of **\$500** will be awarded annually to a Winnetonka sophomore. The money will remain with the North Kansas City Schools Education Foundation until you have graduated from high school and been accepted at a two- or four-year institution, or technical school.

Guidelines: Payment of the scholarship will be made directly to the institution you will attend after graduating from high school.

Process: The selection committee will consist of a Moore family member and community representatives.

Deadline: Friday, April 28, 2023
